THE BRILLIANT CURLEW.

GMELIN saw this species of bird near the Tanais and Choper; but it is not limited to those countries of the north where Gmelin observed it; for, according to Mr. Latham, an individual of this species has been killed in the county of Cornwall.

It is not without reason that this bird has been denominated the fiery curlew, and the brilliant curlew, for its plumage is tinged with the most vivid and beautiful colours. On its body there are lines of shining blue, black, and golden green; underneath they are less lively and less varied, and the ground colour is a shining blackish red; black feathers, with a whitish fringe, like a border, cover the head and neck; the quill feathers of the wings and the tail glitter with a golden green, and the
