

2. CORYNE,* Gærtner.

CHARACTER.—*Polypes fixed, single, naked, cylindrical, or claviform but contractile, the head with scattered filiform smooth tentacula : mouth 0 ?*

1. *C. SQUAMATA*, *body more or less clavate ; the tentacula shorter than the body.* Gærtner.†

† Gærtner, Joseph, M. D. a native of Wurtemberg, born in 1732 ; elected F. R. S. in 1761 ; died in 1791. Having visited England, he made several zoological discoveries on the southern coast, published in the Phil. Trans., and the Spicilegia Zoologica of Pallas. He is celebrated for his work “De Fructibus et Seminibus Plantarum.” There is an interesting biographical sketch of him in Thomson’s *History of the Royal Society*, p. 46–7.
