

FAMILY III. SERTULARIADÆ.

5. Thoa,* Lamouroux.

Character.—Polypidoms rooted, arbuscular: the stem composed of aggregated subparallel capillary tubes; the branches alternate, spreading bifariously: cells tubular, indistinct, alternate: ovarian-vesicles irregularly scattered.—Polypes hydraform, scarcely retractile within their cells.
