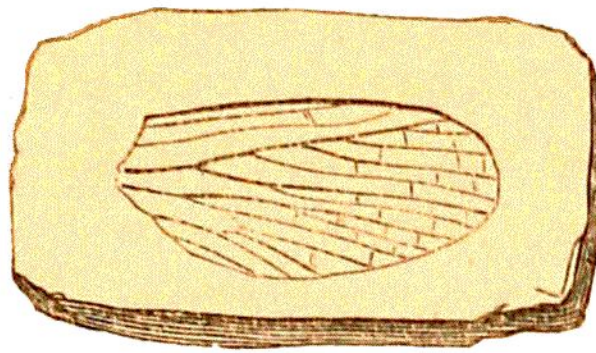
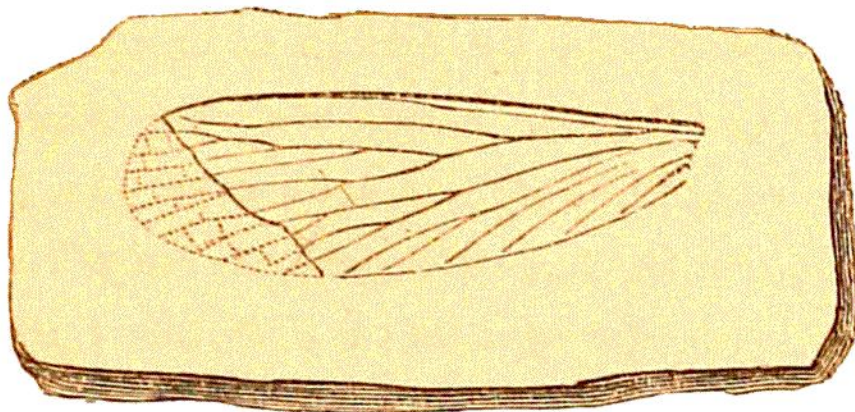

figures of two specimens from the cabinet of the Society; they are represented twice the natural size; they resemble the wings of a recent genus of Neuroptera, termed *Panorpa*; particularly *P. Germanica*. The transverse lines are not fractures,
