

behind abruptly-terminating vertebræ, (fig. 52,) in the same

* In the following diagram a few simple lines serve to exhibit the progress of degradation. Fig. a represents the symmetrical Placoids of the Silurian period, consisting of head, neck, body, tail, fore limbs and hinder limbs; fig. b represents those heterocercal Ga noids of the Old Red Sandstone, Coal Measures, and Permian System, n which the neck is extinguished, and the fore limbs stuck on to the acciput; fig. c, those homocercal Ganoids of the Trias Lias, Oolite, and
