soldier crab. The shell finally becomes dissolved away—how, it is not known—by the growing Zoanthid; but the crab holds on to its house, although at the expense of transporting wherever it goes a colony of flowering polyps. The polyps are but partly expanded in figure 1, and wholly so in figure 2.
