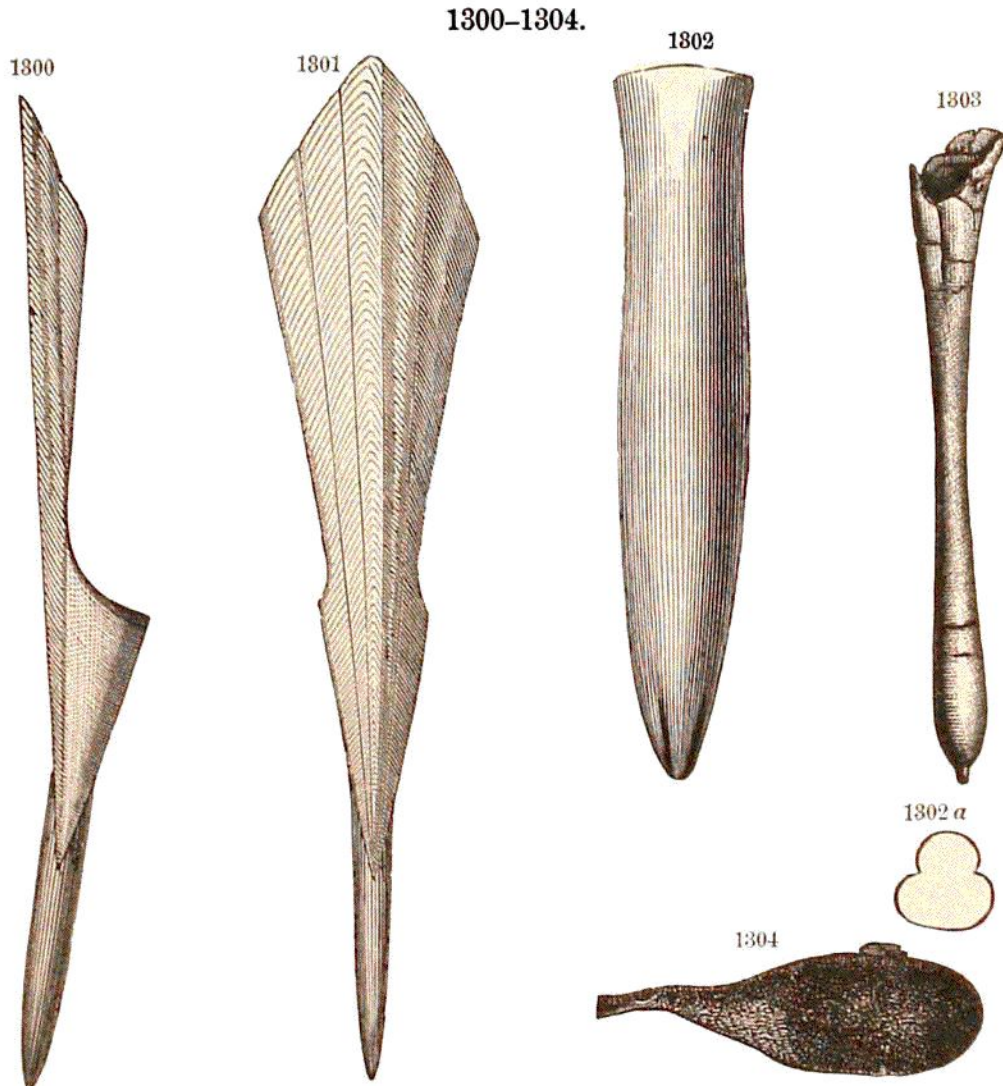

Buckland states that he had drawings of the remains of extinct species made with their own ink.

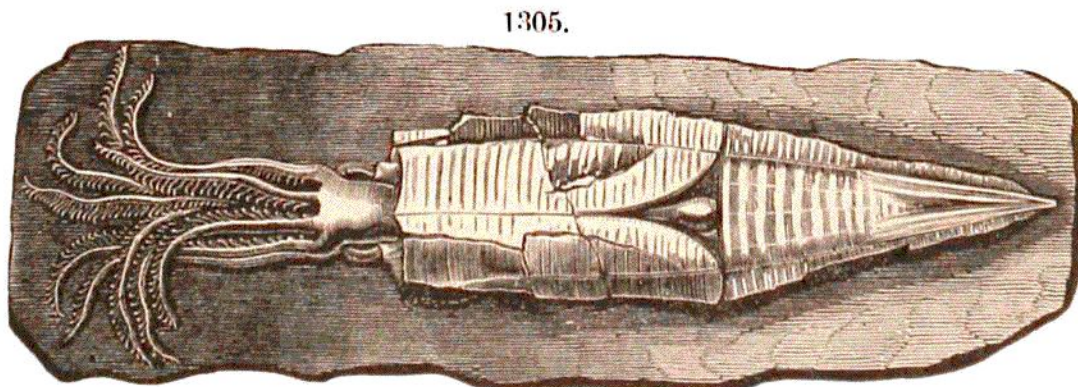


Fig. 1305, *Belemnoteuthis antiqua* ($\times \frac{1}{2}$), of the Oxford clay. From Mantell.
