

Another species, more closely like Hadrosaurus, is the *Diclonius mirabilis* of Cope (1883; *Trachodon mirabilis* of Leidy, 1868), from the Laramie beds of Dakota. The length stated is 38 feet, and that of the head, $3\frac{1}{8}$ feet.



Widely different were the Herbivorous Dinosaurs of the family Ceratopsidæ of Marsh, — species of great magnitude, having the horns of cattle with
